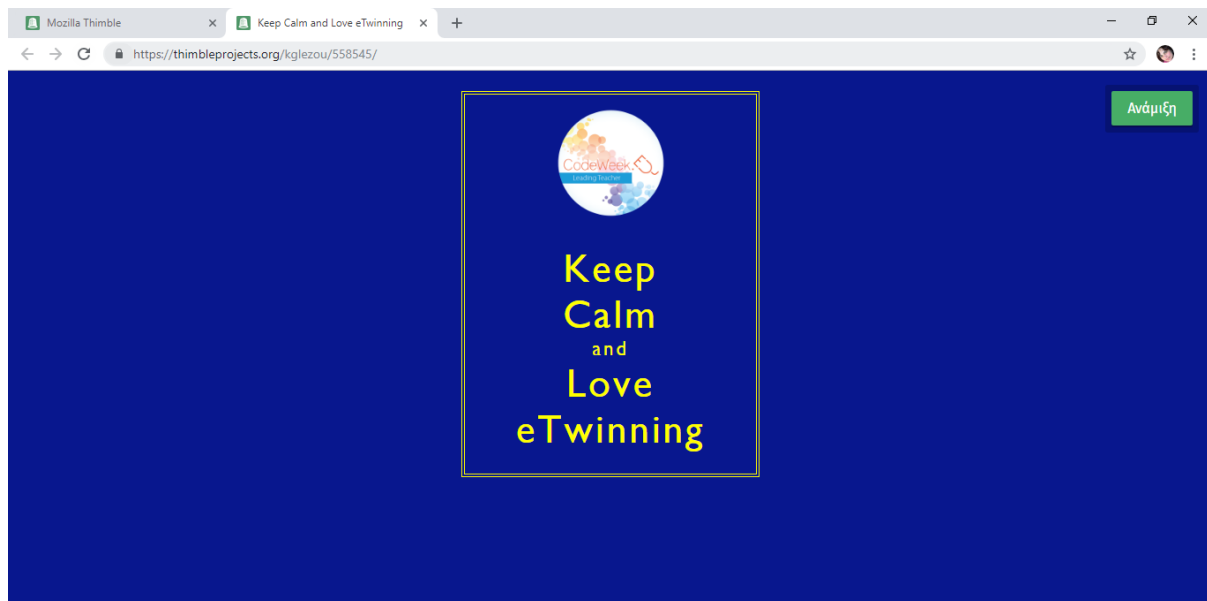


Activity “Keep Calm Poster”

Hello! Follow the steps in this tutorial to learn how to change the words, colors and images in the Keep Calm Poster by editing HTML & CSS.

1. Change the words of the poster

Go to line 18 of index.html and change the text inside the h1 tag to something new. Switch to Preview mode to see your changes as you type.

Tip: The **
** tag represents a line break. Unlike most tags, **
** tags do not need a corresponding closing tag.

2. Change the background color

Use the file tree on the left side of the screen to open the style.css file.

Go to line 2 to change the background-color property. Replace color with a different color, like yellowgreen. Be sure not to have spaces between the words that describe your color.

Another option is to use a **color picker**. Click on the word yellowgreen (or whatever color you wrote) and then click Control + E on a Windows keyboard,

or Command+E on a Mac. You should see a color picker. Play around with it until you find a color you like.

3. Change the Thimble image

This project comes with two built-in image options — the crown and a thimble. You can see the thimble by clicking on `thimble.svg` in the file tree.

1. Open the `index.html` file.
2. On line 14 you can see the where the crown image is inserted.
3. Replace `crown.svg` with `thimble.svg`.

You can also **add an image from your computer** to your file tree and use it in your poster. Click the green + button at the top of the file tree and choose the "Upload" option. Drag a file from your desktop, find the file on your computer, or take a selfie using your computer's camera!

4. Change fonts

Go to line 1 of the `style.css` file. You'll see the properties defined for the body of the poster. Play around by editing some of the properties. For example, change the color property to green or the `text-align` to right.

On line 16, you'll see the properties defined for the `h1` text in the poster. `h1` means "header 1." Play around by editing some of the properties. For example, increase the font-size to 70px, increase the letter-spacing to 4px, change the `text-transform` to lowercase, and the font-weight to bold.

5. Share your poster

When you're ready to share your poster, click the **Publish** button in the top right hand corner. Give your project a description and then click the green **Publish** button. You'll see a URL for your project. Send the URL to your family and friends, or post it on Facebook or Twitter using the hashtag #teachtheweb.
