

## eTwinning Seminar for teachers working at schools in disadvantaged areas

Schools in disadvantaged areas are often situated in inner cities or in suburban areas, but can also be found in smaller cities. Teachers working at those schools in Europe often face the problem that their pupils have a difficult social and economic background and often cause problems in the classroom. Either they have learning difficulties, problems with violence or with a simple refusal of normal lessons. Pupils need to be prouder of their school. European school projects are a suitable means to motivate and to involve the pupils.

The Swedish and German eTwinning National Support services (Swedish Council of Higher Education and Pädagogischer Austauschdienst der Kultusministerkonferenz) are co-organizing an eTwinning seminar for around 80 participants in Hamburg from 21-23 May 2015. The seminar will give teachers working at schools in disadvantaged areas in different European countries the opportunity to share their experiences and to develop eTwinning projects.
